Spool Block

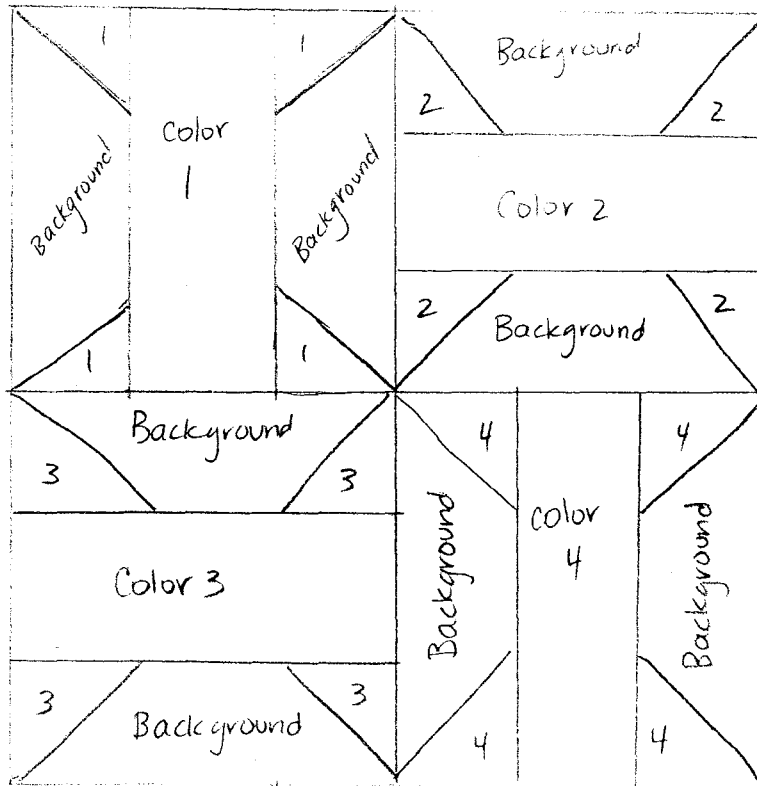
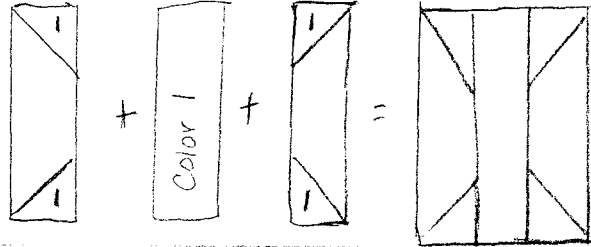
We will be making 4 squares, then sewing them together to form the completed BOM.

Background fabric: tan print – more to the light brownish tone, rather than yellow.
For each square cut 2 rectangles 2" x 5"
(you will need 8 rectangles for the 4 squares)

Spool colors: 4 assorted warm country prints
For each square, and from each fabric,
cut 1 rectangle 2" x 5" and 2 – 2" x 2" squares

Block Assembly:

Piece the two sides of the spool blocks using the snowball method. Be careful to watch the direction of the corner pieces.
Sew the two sides to the centre spool rectangle.
Your unfinished block should measure 5 inches.
Make 4 squares.
Sew them together turning the direction of the spool.
