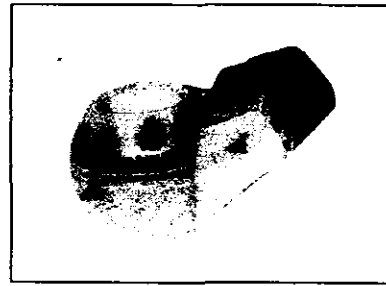


Napkin Cuff



Napkin cuffs are easy and quick to make and add a beautiful touch to your dinner setting. They are a pleasant change from napkin rings. You can add your decorative touches with lace, trims, embroidery and even add a name to one. Ideal for holiday gifts, wedding gifts to match the brides china, or better still make a set to match your own china.

You will need.

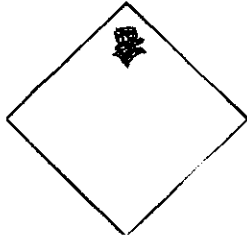
6 1/2" square of fabric for each cuff.

(If you wish to use your embroidery machine to decorate first you will need a larger piece to fit hoop and then cut down to size required.)

14" lace edging or trim

Instructions:

Place a decorative motif or embroidery in one corner of the square (diagram 1)

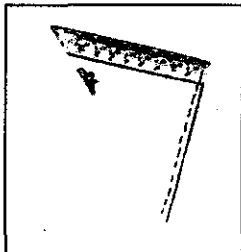
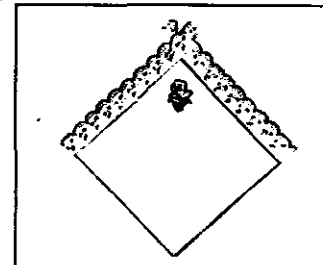


Starch and lightly press the lace edging.

Cut the lace edging or trim to 7" lengths. (You will need 2 for each cuff)

Sew the lace to two sides of the square that meet above the embroidery.

Miter the lace where it meets in the centre.



Sew a French seam on the remaining two sides (the 2 sides without lace)
Turn to the right sides and press lightly.

Just slip a napkin into the cuff and you have a lovely place setting.

You can make these cuffs any size you would like using

7 1/2" or 8 1/2" squares.
